In summer, Norway becomes the land of eternal daylight, with 24 hours of visible sun above the Arctic Circle. Not only are the long, leisurely sunsets a glorious sight, you also have more hours in the day for exploring. In winter, the Northern Lights, also known as the Aurora Borealis, dance in the Norwegian night sky. The best chance to see this magical light show is between October and March. 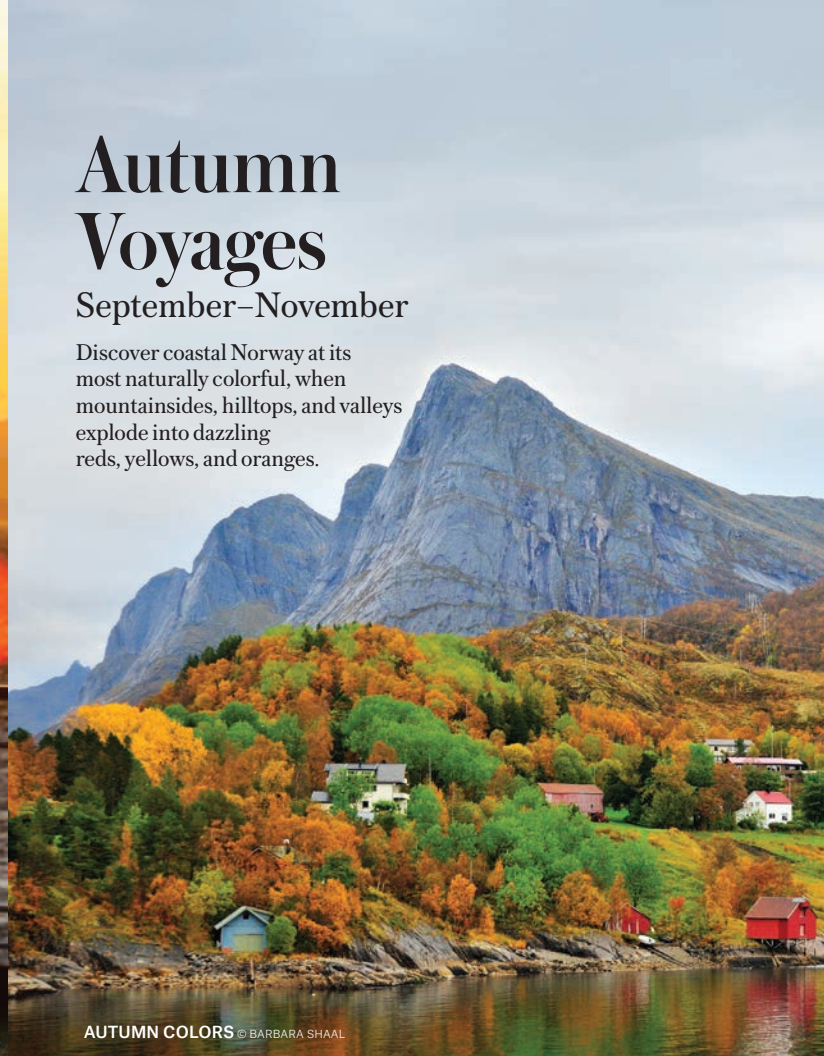

KIRKENES – BERGEN

—Begin in the Arctic, meandering south through some of the most picturesque landscapes on Earth.

Start your 6-day southbound journey in Kirkenes. Then get ready for a taste of Arctic adventure as you experience northern Norway's polar heritage and sail through dramatic glacial scenery. As we sail south, you'll see some of the world's most beautiful fjord landscapes, the highlights of which are the Vesterålen and Lofoten Islands, where steep mountains plunge straight into the sea. After crossing the Arctic Circle, you'll notice the milder fjord climate, farmland, and fishing villages before we end our journey in the charming city of Bergen.

Arrive in Kirkenes. Embark the ship and enjoy the relaxed ambience of life on board.

DAY 2: HAMMERFEST AND TROMSØ

Hammerfest, the world's northernmost town, is our first major stop before we continue to Tromsø.

DAY 3: VESTERÅLEN AND LOFOTEN ISLANDS

Passing through the glorious Lofoten Islands, the ship negotiates a stunning network of inlets and isles.

DAY 4: ARCTIC CIRCLE, SEVEN SISTERS

After crossing the Arctic Circle, see the Seven Sisters mountain range and Torghatten, the mountain with the hole in the middle of it.

DAY 5: TRONDHEIM AND KRISTIANSUND

When we arrive in the medieval city of Trondheim, you can visit Nidaros Cathedral. We make brief calls at Kristiansund and Molde before a midnight call at Ålesund.

DAY 6: BERGEN, DISEMBARKATION

Your arrival in Bergen sees the end of this magnificent journey.
